



**INTEGRATION APIN WITH IPIN  
FOR NATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS, TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS AND REFEREES  
AT 2014 ATF JUNIOR TENNIS TOURS 14 AND UNDER NOTICE**

**APIN ► IPIN**

As you all are aware, the Asian Tennis Federation completely automated the Asian Junior tour and had launched the Asian Players Identification Number (APIN) whereby every Asian player would have received a distinct identifying number, which would assist them to be managed efficiently. Having a personal identification number enables a player to manage his/her tournaments, profile, entry or exit from tournaments online, which eases managing of the entire ranking and tournament structure from not only a player's perspective, rather from an organizational point of view as well. Furthermore, you must be aware that the ITF and other Regional Associations have or are presently considering introducing a similar identification process, where every player in the Juniors, Pro Circuits, Seniors and Wheelchair tennis is identified with their International Players Identification Number (IPIN). Once a player is assigned an IPIN, it remains the same for the rest of his/her playing career. It makes it easier to identify and manage the player's data and all other aspects of his/her playing career.

Thus the ITF and ATF have agreed to integrate the system so therefore players can have only one Identification number which is the IPIN(International Players Identification Number) for whole his/her playing Career.

**To play in the ATF JUNIOR TENNIS**

To play in the ATF JUNIOR TENNIS Tour, players must have registered with the ITF for a Junior IPIN membership (International Player Identification Number). Players register online directly on the ITF website ([www.itftennis.com/IPIN](http://www.itftennis.com/IPIN)) or through the Asian Tennis Federation tournament website. (<http://atf.tournamentsoftware.com/>)

If players have already had their own APINs, the system will automatically provide new IPIN for them. So when you register IPIN you have to use same information which you have in the ATF system.

The player must also pay the annual IPIN fee, either by credit card during the registration process or during the annual renewal process for subsequent years. Alternatively players may choose to pay the IPIN fee at the first tournament they play.

There are two IPIN fees depending on the membership level:

- For 2014 the Junior IPIN fee is USD 35 and allows the player to play on the ITF Junior Circuit and the 2014 ATF Junior tennis tours (subject to fulfilling the age criteria).
- Players may choose to pay the Pro IPIN fee of USD 60 (or at any time upgrade their Junior IPIN membership to the Pro membership by paying the difference to ITF). The Pro IPIN membership allows the player to also enter the ITF Pro Circuit events (subject to fulfilling the age criteria) in addition to the ITF and Asian Junior events.

Players will not be allowed to enter an event until the IPIN registration is complete and the payment option has been selected. Neither will a player be allowed to sign-in as an On-site Alternate or play as a Wild Card without having registered for an IPIN and paid the yearly IPIN fee.
